INTRODUCTION

St Monica's Hospital was founded in 1893 by Mrs Katherine Love, benefactor and member of a family who lived at The Hawkhill, near Easingwold. The Hospital is now designated a Community Hospital and is administered by the North Yorkshire and York Primary Care Trust, which is fully committed to the continuing role of the Hospital in the community.

St Monica's Hospital is a small 12-bedded hospital with 4 single rooms (2 en-suite), 1 two-bedded room and 2 three-bedded rooms, all having views onto the Hospital grounds. It provides nursing and medical care for the acutely ill, for those between hospital and home and for the terminally ill. Access to St Monica's is through the appropriate General Practitioner. It has its own Physiotherapist and Occupational Therapist on staff as well as a minor injuries department. There is no outpatient facility for emergencies.

THE LEAGUE OF FRIENDS OF ST MONICA'S HOSPITAL

The generous support and continuing interest of the Friends, as well as the local community, has done much to convince the Trust of the value of this local institution. Founded in 1969 to support and promote the work of the Hospital, the main aim then was to provide a physiotherapy unit. Since its foundation, the Friends have continued to raise funds for various projects to meet nursing and medical needs.

To mark the centenary in June 1993 of the Hospital's foundation, the Friends, with the support of the York Health Services NHS Trust, launched the Centenary Appeal with the aim of raising £150,000 to provide an Occupational Therapy Unit, to upgrade the Day Room and other facilities. Thanks to the overwhelming support of the people of Easingwold and district, the whole amount was raised and the Unit was opened by HRH the Duchess of Kent in October 1993. In 1994, a Garden Room extension to the Day Room was built at a cost of £48,000. The Millennium Project which raised £170,000 to extend the entrance and waiting areas was opened by local businessman Ron Moverley on 14 July 2000. The Jean Farghar Resource Centre was opened by HRH the Duchess of Gloucester on 24 October 2005. This was funded at a cost of £178,973 and has a meeting room, kitchen, toilet, store room and a small office.

In addition, there is a team of volunteers who serve teas and coffees as well as making sure the plants and flowers are looked after. If you would like to help with this, please contact the Secretary on 01347 823622.

- Assessment of needs – with physiotherapists, occupational therapists, nurses and social workers assessing and supporting patients living at home or transferring to long term care
- Minor injuries treatment – 8:30am to 6:00pm, Monday to Friday
- Chiropodist visits as requested
- *The Press* and *Yorkshire Post* are delivered daily and patients may order other newspapers to be delivered to the Hospital at their own expense
- A telephone for use by patients, provided by the Friends
- Routine visiting times are 11:00am to 12:00 noon and 2:30pm to 8:30pm. Children are permitted to visit as appropriate

HOSPITAL STAFF LEVELS

24 hour cover:

- 1 Registered Nurse and 1 Health Care Assistant on each shift
- 1 Health Care Assistant in addition for morning shifts
- Occupational Therapist 12 hours per week
- Physiotherapist 12 hours per week for in-patients, and 10 hours per week in the Community

PHYSIOTHERAPY UNIT

Physiotherapists work over 5 day period and additional 2 days
Referrals from York Hospital and GPs

WEEKEND AND OUT OF HOURS COVER

In the event of minor injury, the nurse on duty will assess the situation, give advice and refer to the Unscheduled Care Service at Northallerton or York
